


IN THE KNOW

COMMUNITYBEAUTIFICATION

CITRUS HEIGHTS RESIDENTS HAVE SHARED THAT THEIR TOP 3 PRIORITIES FOR COMMUNITY BEAUTIFICATION ARE:

Cleaning up unlawful camps - Addressing Illegal dumping - Removing trash and litter

The City of Citrus Heights is taking big steps to beautify our community in these areas and more by creating a comprehensive toolbox to achieve a new level of community cleanliness and pride. The tools making impact include:



- PROACTIVE BEAUTIFICATION CREW: A twoperson full time crew and fully stocked truck patrolling and proactively maintaining public areas, including: removing abandoned carts and debris, unlawful camp abatement, illegal dumps, trash/litter removal, graffiti and debris removal, illegal sign removal from poles and public spaces, and weed abatement.
- HOMELESS NAVIGATOR PROGRAM: This program provides counseling services and resources for those at risk of becoming homeless and services for those who are currently homeless. Resources include housing deposits, motel stays, food, transportation, and more. Call 916-533-3069 for more information.
- WORKING WITH OUR NEIGHBORS: Many blight issues take place right outside city borders. We are partnering with other government agencies that have jurisdictional responsibilities for public areas within or that share borders with the City (like Caltrans) to increase clean up and enforcement.

SHOPPING CART ORDINANCE: This ordinance ensures shopping carts do not leave the sites where they belong. When they do they can often become unsightly obstacles that find their way into our Creek corridors. It will also allow quicker City clean up response by reducing the timeframe necessary for the Beautification Crew or Police Department to impound shopping carts.

CHRONIC NUISANCE OFFENDER PROGRAM: Citrus Heights Police Department has implemented this program to prosecute chronic offenders of codes and ordinances for individuals and property. Additionally, severe cases will now have the potential to be referred for community prosecution.

COMMUNITYBEAUTIFICATION

Are you a Citrus Heights resident? You can show your care by:

LANDSCAPE

Overgrown and neglected landscaping are signs the residence is not frequently occupied and invites unwanted trespassing. Maintain your ground landscaping below 12" in height. Branches and hedges should not block your residence's visibility. Consider drought friendly landscape for beautification, reach out to your local water provider for options.

GENERAL UPKEEP

Maintain the property free of junk & debris, litter, inoperable/abandoned vehicles. Reach out to Republic Services (916-725-9060) to learn about neighborhood cleanups and to remove bulky trash.

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR

Report any suspicious or unusual activity in the neighborhood. Use cameras to provide 24/7 surveillance and be willing to share footage with your neighbors.

LIGHTS

Install lighting. Most crime happens in the dark. LED lighting allows true colors to be seen at night on camera. Notice a street lamp that is not working? Text "SERVICE REQUEST" to Hello CH at 844-95-HELLO to report it through our SeeClickFix reporting system.

HELP US IDENTIFY REPAIR AND CLEANUP NEEDS

The City is committed to providing regular and timely maintenance to public right of ways, streets lights, traffic equipment and more. Are you a Citrus Heights business? You can show your care by:

CAMERAS

Surveillance is your 24/7 witness to help law enforcement catch criminals. Invest in quality surveillance with remote viewing. Place cameras inside and outside of your business.

LOCK IT UP

Keep your dumpsters locked and inside enclosures. Unlocked dumpsters invite unwanted trespassers and activity. Any outdoor power sources should also be locked to deter unwanted users.

GRAFFITI

When you're the victim of graffiti, notify the Police Department, and we'll work with you to identify resources to abate it. The sooner it's covered, the less likely it will return.

Are you unhoused? You can show your care by:

CLEANING UP AFTER YOURSELF

We're all responsible for keeping our community clean and vibrant. Please don't leave trash or debris in the public right of way including open space.

DO NOT TRESSPASS

Be respectful and do not occupy private space without consent from the owner.
