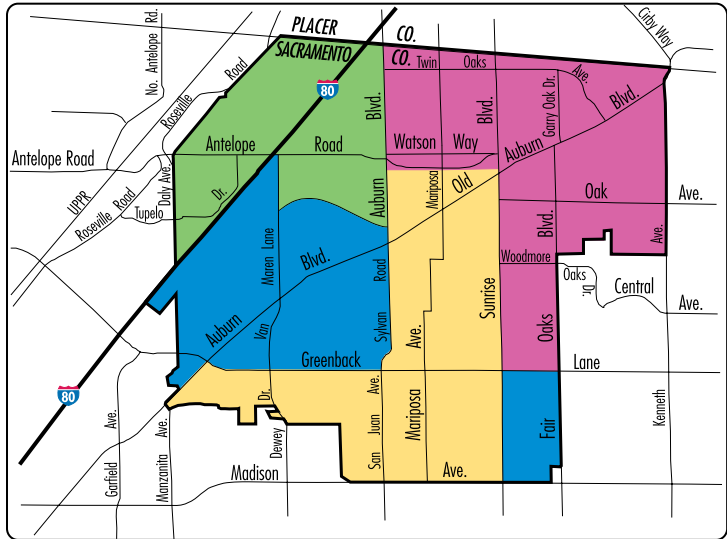


NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUPS

Allied Waste Services provides cleanup collections in your neighborhood 3 times a year. The color-coded map shows in which months collections will occur in your area within the City of Citrus Heights.



Citrus Heights

August, December and April

November, March and July

September, January and May

October, February and June

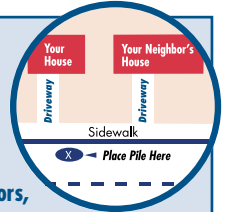
WHEN TO SET OUT PILE

Please do not set items out more than two (2) days early. Material must be out by 6 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.

NOTE: There may be a one- or two-day collection delay due to load factors.

WHERE TO PLACE PILE

Place items at the curb, not in the gutter. Place appliances, tires, monitors, TVs and computers 1 to 2 feet from pile.



PILE OVER 10 YARDS — MINIMUM \$95.48 CHARGE

Pile size is limited to 10 cubic yards or about 10' x 7' x 4'. Residents who exceed the pile size may be subject to an excessive pile charge.

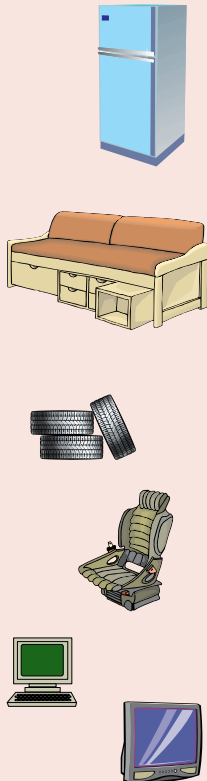
Minimum charge is \$95.48 and can increase, based upon the amount of material set out.

ACCEPTED

REUSE: Consider recycling first by donating reusable items. Call Allied Waste for a list of thrift stores within or near Citrus Heights.

Acceptable items include but are not limited to:

- ✓ Appliances (place away from pile for separate collection)
- ✓ Barbeques
- ✓ Branches (maximum 4" in diameter and 6' in length)
- ✓ Carpeting (rolled and tied)
- ✓ Furniture (chairs, sofas, dining tables)
- ✓ Leaves/yard clippings (must bag)
- ✓ Mattresses
- ✓ Plastic pipes (maximum 6' in length)
- ✓ Tires (place away from pile for separate collection)
- ✓ Toys
- ✓ Wood (including lumber and disassembled fencing)
- ✓ Electronic waste (place away from pile for separate collection)
 - Cell phones
 - Computers and monitors
 - Microwave ovens
 - Peripheral computer equipment
 - Televisions, VCRs, DVD players



NOT ACCEPTED

Do NOT set out unacceptable items including:

- ✗ Automobiles or auto parts
- ✗ Boats or boat parts
- ✗ Backyard spas
- ✗ Batteries of any kind
- ✗ Bullets/shells/explosives
- ✗ Construction material such as concrete, dirt, rocks, bricks, sheetrock, roofing material
- ✗ Large tree stumps
- ✗ Medical waste
- ✗ Propane tanks
- ✗ Steel pipes
- ✗ Hazardous waste of any kind such as:
 - Liquid paint
 - Cleaning products
 - Pesticides
 - Pool chemicals
 - Products labeled toxic/poison
