Household Hazardous Waste

Used Motor Oil and Oil Filters

Used motor oil and oil filters can be recycled curbside.

- Pour oil into a clear plastic container like a plastic milk jug or container provided by Allied Waste.
- Tape lid to close it securely.
- Place oil filters in a sealable plastic bag, i.e., Ziploc, or an oil filter bag provided free by Allied Waste. Call (916) 638-9000 or 725-9060 for a bag.
- Place containers and/or filters on curb next to recycle cart.
- Maximum 3 gallons of oil per pickup.
- Drain filter 24 hours before bagging. One filter per bag.
- Wipe excess oil off bag, seal.
- Place filter bag beside your recycling cart or, if recycling used oil, hang the bag on oil container using precut hole at the top of the bag.
- Allied Waste will leave replacement bags and containers.
- Oil and filters are collected on recycle weeks only.

How to Dispose of Household Hazardous Waste

Do not place household hazardous waste (HHW), including paint, pesticides and cleaning products, in any of your carts or in your bulky item cleanup pile.

Residents may take up to 15 gallons of their household hazardous waste (HHW) for FREE disposal at the North Area Recovery Station, located at 4450 Roseville Road.
